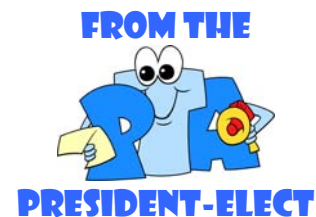

Once again, this is a reminder to work on the Soaring Eagle Award requirements with your child. Help them discover talents that may be hiding within! Walking In A Winter Wonderland

Walking in icy, snowy weather can be dangerous, but these tips from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration can help make your trek safer.

- Dress in layers and wear boots with nonskid soles. Wear a bright scarf or hat or reflective gear so drivers can see you.
- Walk on sidewalks if possible. If sidewalks are covered in snow and ice and you must walk in the street, walk against the flow of traffic and as close to the curb as you can.
- Don't wear a hat or scarf that blocks your vision or makes it hard for you to hear traffic.
- When traveling with babies or small children, dress them in bright or reflective clothing. Always keep children--whether in a stroller or on foot--in front of you and as close to the curb as possible.
- Before you step off the curb, make sure oncoming cars and trucks have come to a complete stop.
- Continue to use crosswalks and wait for crossing guards whenever possible.

I would like to think everyone who visited our Book Fair during SEP Conferences in November. It was a big success! While Oakcrest lost 40% of its students to Falcon Ridge Elementary, our Book Fair sales only decreased by 30%. This means compared to last year our book sales increased by 10%. The total sales for our Book Fair was \$5,323.05. **A+ Book Fairs** gave 65% back to our school in book credit. This gave **\$3,459.98** in book credit back to Oakcrest. With this book credit we are able to give books to the library, literacy program, teachers and faculty. We also use it to supply our students with their first book at Kindergarten orientation we have every April, or for prizes during our school ribbon weeks.

A+ Book Fairs gave us an additional \$500 in book credit in incentives for our sales goals and for paying them on time. The PTA used this \$500 in book credit right away to give a book for each teacher. We also gave \$75 worth of books to the Oakcrest library and \$50 worth of books to the Literacy Program.

The wish baskets for the teachers were a big hit again this year. Teachers had the opportunity to place books in their baskets that they would like added to their classroom as resources to have their students use to improve their reading. Thank you for everyone who purchased books to give to their teachers!



I look forward to our next Book Fair during SEP Conferences in March 2009. This will be our buy-one-get-one-free Book Fair that we have every spring.

Be sure to speak with your student's teacher if you have any questions concerning this month's curriculum focus.

Kindergarten: Beginning sounds, blending short vowel sounds, patterning, measurement, and holidays.

First Grade: Holiday traditions from around the world intergraded with math, language arts, science, and social studies.

Second Grade: Continue working on addition, subtraction, and guided reading concepts. Will be learning Christmas songs as well as Christmas traditions from around the world.

Third Grade: number operations, time money, writing skills (story structure), comprehension, and government.

Fourth: The meaning of multiplication and division, money, fossils, the water cycle, rocks, minerals, and Christmas Around the World.

Fifth: Social Studies-Benjamin Franklin and Early Colonization, Math-working on prime and composite numbers, as well as exponents, Science-Prevention Dimension, Language Arts-Five paragraph essays.

Sixth: microorganisms, fractions, space, Ancient Greece, and Dare.

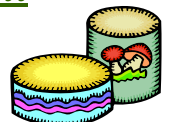
