From The Principal's Desk

Dear Parents,

Thanks to our dear old friend, Punxsutawney Phil, we have the joy of having a few more weeks of winter. And what comes with winter? Snow, wind, ice, cold temperatures, and more snow. We are however on the downhill slope so to speak. With this in mind, I thought it important to review both attendance and safety with you.



Because this is the time of year for cold weather mixed with bouts of warmer days, students sometimes come down with colds. If your children do get sick and you decide to keep them home it is very important that you notify the office each day they are sick. In this way we are able to excuse the absence for your student. If we receive no contact then we are unable to excuse the absence. Anytime a student is gone from school parents need to quickly call the office and let the school know. Attendance is so important. When students are gone it is easy to fall behind quickly, so notifying the office and keeping the teacher informed can help. It is also a good idea to have a sibling pick up work if and when a child is gone multiple days.

In regards to safety, please remember the following. When it is cold outside, make sure students come to school dressed appropriately. We try to send the students outside whenever possible, weather permitting. Students need to remember to wear coats, boots (with a change of shoes in their backpack if desired), hats, gloves, scarves, etc. each day. It might be a good idea to send some of these items in backpacks daily, just in case. Students need a chance daily to go outside and run around. Both the teachers and the students are rejuvenated after a short break.

Winter weather always seems to wreak havoc upon morning and afternoon drop offs. Please remember the drop off zone at the front of the school is just for unloading. Parents, please do not have students exit the car from the opposite side, and please do not place your car in park and get out. This lane needs to have a steady flow. Also, when parking in the parking lot, remember that striped lines mean "No Parking" and that the handicapped spots are there for those who have legal permits. The handicapped spots are not "quick drop-off spots." Note also that the bus lane on the opposite side of the school is not a parent drop-off. Do not take students to that side of the building when coming to school or picking up from school.

Finally, please know that all the teachers and staff that are outside assisting in the mornings and afternoons are there for one purpose: to keep your children safe. With this in mind, please remember to be courteous; they are all doing their best. It is quite difficult when parents choose to not follow procedures set in place for student safety. Let's all work together to make our school a safe and happy place to be.

Character Counts

[The Paradoxical Commandments 607.2](#)

In 1968, when Kent M. Keith was a 19-year-old sophomore at Harvard, he wrote the Paradoxical Commandments as part of a booklet for student leaders. He describes the "Commandments" as guidelines for finding personal meaning in the face of adversity:

1. People are illogical, unreasonable, and self-centered. Love them anyway.
2. If you do good, people will accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives. Do good anyway.
3. If you are successful, you will win false friends and true enemies. Succeed anyway.
4. The good you do today will be forgotten tomorrow. Do good anyway.
5. Honesty and frankness make you vulnerable. Be honest and frank anyway.
6. The biggest men and women with the biggest ideas can be shot down by the smallest men and women with the smallest minds. Think big anyway.
7. People favor underdogs but follow only top dogs. Fight for a few underdogs anyway.
8. What you spend years building may be destroyed overnight. Build anyway.
9. People need help but may attack you if you help them. Help people anyway.
10. Give the world the best you have and you may get kicked in the teeth. Give the world the best you have anyway.

The essence of these Commandments is that each of us must choose to do what we think we should do, even when we think we have good reasons not to. They remind us that we are capable of rising above common practices that demean our nature and our culture.

We can rationalize distorting the Golden Rule as "Do unto others as they have done onto you" or "Do unto others before they do onto you" but, in the terminology of the '60s, we then become part of the problem rather than the solution.

This is Michael Josephson reminding you that character counts.

Be sure to speak with your student's teacher if you have any questions concerning this month's curriculum focus.

Kindergarten: will be learning about weather, water, St. Patrick's Day, blending sounds, sight words, middle sounds, addition, measurement, and money.

First Grade: St. Patrick's Day, shamrocks, sight words, time, money, spring, and weather are just a few of the wonderful learning opportunities we will have this month.

Second Grade: Math will be concepts of time, adding and subtracting with and without regrouping. The language arts focus will be on comprehension and dictionary skills. Mapping, rocks, and diversity in our communities will round out the month.

Third Grade: during the month of March we will be focusing on multiplication, subtraction with regrouping, South America, Man vs. Environment, citizenship, dialogue, Articles, Research, and punctuation.

Fourth Grade: our areas of focus will be poetry, rocks, minerals, soil, fossils, weather, multiplication, long division, geometry, and adjectives.

Fifth Grade: will be reading Tuck Everlasting. In math the focus will be on fractions and number concepts. Physical and chemical reactions with matter will be the science focus with states, capitals, and the revolutionary war being the social studies focus.

Sixth Grade: Students will be graduating from Dare, learning how to use multimedia for gathering and presenting projects. They also will be learning about Ancient Egypt, the Renaissance, locations on a map and the Middle Ages. Math concepts will be measurement, probability, decimals, problem solving, and formulas.
