## Letter From The Editor



You probably have noticed some changes to the Oakcrest PTA Newsletter this year. We strive to continue to improve our communication to parents, teachers and students. This year we added a two-month calendar at the end of the newsletter. We hope that everyone takes advantage of the calendar by placing it on your fridge or bulletin board to help you plan for upcoming school activities and events. We don't want you to miss anything!

Jennifer Higley, our Student Birthday Coordinator, has done a great job to add the monthly birthdays for the students in each newsletter. We want each child to feel valued on their special day, by seeing their name printed in the newsletter.

In October we made two great improvements. Many households have two, three or even four children attending Oakcrest. This meant some homes would receive up to four copies of the newsletter each month. This was a huge waste of paper. ## From The Principal's Desk

We are pleased to inform you that the Oakcrest School Community Council (SCC) has completed and approved the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP) for the 2008-2009 school year. CSIP funds are provided through a Jordan School District grant program in which school proposals are reviewed and ratified first by the SCC and then by the School Board. Schools applying for CSIP funding are charged with identifying their most critical academic need. This year, Oakcrest qualified for an additional \$28,000 in funding through the CSIP. Funding has also been received through the State's Land Trust program to administer the programs described below.



The SCC determined that CSIP funding will be used to continue two highly successful reading tutoring programs. STAR Reading, a tutoring program that has been established in coordination with the Utah State Office of Education, provides direct tutoring to students during the school day. In addition, STAR reading provides training to parents who wish to tutor their own children at home utilizing a proven, structured, research-based program that is highly effective in improving students' reading.

The second tutoring program that is funded by the CSIP is under the direction of Oakcrest's Reading Specialists, Jane Smith and Malia Allsop. Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Allsop have trained a cadre of instructional assistants to provide small-group tutoring to lower-grade students throughout the school day. The purpose of their tutoring is to achieve Oakcrest's goal of having all students read on or above grade level by third grade. Data gathered through student reading level assessments have shown that students receiving service through this program have made outstanding gains.

We are pleased to continue both the STAR and Oakcrest reading programs. We are grateful to the School Board and Legislature for making the CSIP and Land Trust funds available for schools. We are also grateful for the work of our current SCC, as well as those in the past, who have helped form and shape the programs described above. Sincerely,

This is a very significant month at Oakcrest as we hold our first SEP conferences. Just what exactly does SEP stand for? Gee....when I was in elementary school...it was called Parent/Teacher Conferences and I stayed home while my parents attended the school. I regularly found this a great time to spruce up the house...do dishes...run a vacuum...and tidy my room...☺ Times have changed...and the SEP...known as the Student Education Plan very much involves the student with the teacher and parent.



If you are a new or newer school parent...the SEP might have you more anxious than your student. Rest assured...the SEP is a plan that not only helps the student...but the parent too. The process begins by identifying strengths as well as weaknesses. The strengths become a vital part of the child's capability for overcoming skill deficits. You are shown how to select the most important areas on which the child should focus for the reporting period...and goals are then developed for each area of weakness. Like a road map, each goal is provided with suggestions to help you and your child fine tune the plan to make sure that teaching is effective...and learning is accomplished.

Plan to make the SEP conference a special time for your children!! Celebrate and Recognize the successes!! When opportunities exist....Celebrate and Recognize the PLAN that you have created with your student and teacher to improve, increase, and succeed.

Approaching the SEP with respect is the key for both parents and teachers during conference time and throughout the year. You both come to the table with your own unique expertise. You know your child best and understand what drives your children; their strengths, weaknesses, dreams, and worries. Teachers come to the table with essential knowledge about learning styles, age-appropriate skills, developmental milestones, and an understanding of where each child is on his/her learning journey.

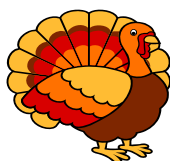
Be prepared for this event!! Make it easy on the whole family. If you have evening conferences... plan ahead for dinner on the day of your conferences. Have your questions ready for both your student and your teacher. Partner with your teacher to be on the same team...rallying for your student. Create a notebook to have specifically for SEP conferences...a 3-Ring Binder works great! Fill it with notepaper and take along a pen to take notes of the plans and discussions. Many times the teacher will make suggestions of resources and materials that may be available for you. Taking notes really helps you to remember an agreed upon plan and strategy too! Lastly...while you are going to SEP conferences to see how your child is doing...please don't forget to ask how the *teacher* is doing. Your teacher may have some needs too...and by checking in with them...you open up communication lines and recognize the place they hold in your child's development. Find out their communication preferences...whether its notes in the backpack, phone calls, email, or a school visit.

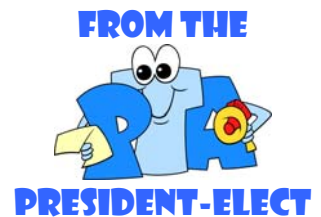

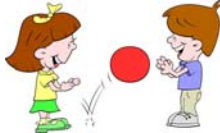
